Grant

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Title II, Part A funding is provided to schools under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The allocation is based on enrollments for both public and nonpublic schools in the FWCS attendance area. An amount of \$321,015.21 has been allocated to serve identified nonpublic schools for Title II, Part A.

Title II is an entitlement grant provided to supplement the general fund. Monies from Title II, Part A will be used to facilitate and implement professional learning. The grant is used for teachers and administrator of all grade levels.

This noncompetitive grant is managed by Ramona Coleman, Director of Professional Learning and addresses advancement intended and outlined in Goal I: *Achieve and Maintain Academic Excellence*.

- Dr. Robinson talked about the student protest scheduled for March 14. FWCS is taking the approach that it is an opportunity for kids to have a civics lesson. Indoor participation has been scheduled and schools are using District guidelines to make school plans. - Dr. Robinson spoke of current legislation and what it means to FWCS. We are especially keeping an eye on HB1426 Education Matters (defines diplomas, special education and graduation, National college entrance exams) and SB65 Instruction on Human Sexuality (opting in/out of instruction). Dr. Robinson also shared that the IDOE passed the assessment schedule for 2018-19.
- Dr. Robinson mentioned the busy weekend for FWCS throughout the state in athletics, bowling, show choir, etc. It was good to see media coverage highlighting the phenomenal things kids do. Thank you to parents, teachers, and administrators for supporting our kids in all these extra areas.
- Glenna Jehl talked about her attendance at the adult graduation ceremony this week. It is real heartening to see what adults have worked through to get their certificate or diploma.
- Anne Duff thanked parents for coming to the meeting and getting involved. It can be frustrating at times but she encourages you to stay involved and keep advocating for education.
- Board President Julie Hollingsworth told parents that Board members are always willing to come to their PTA meetings if they would like; just let them know. Julie also spoke of attending the Continuing Education graduation this week and found it to be a wonderful evening. The speakers and stories were very inspiring. Lastly, Julie mentioned another bill to keep watch of is HB1315. Under this bill, because of their financial distress, Muncie schools would have an appointed school board and Gary schools would have no school board whatsoever.
