

## REPAIR PROGRAM PROGRESS

REPAIR
FWCS

- 13 of 20 total major building renovations are complete.
  - Washington Center Elementary and Lane Middle School to be complete this summer.
  - Northrop High School to be complete in Fall of 2020.
  - Price Elementary and Shawnee Middle School will bid in Fall of 2019.
  - Lindley and Waynedale Elementary to be bid in Fall of 2020.
- 18 Window replacement projects completed.
- At completion of final major renovation projects in 2022, all school buildings will be air conditioned.
- By Fall of 2020, security improvements at 33 buildings will be complete.
- Continued partial roof replacements at 32 buildings has aided in maintaining replacement schedule.

## FINANCIAL OUTLOOK



Maintains maximum tax rate under \$0.3028

### STRATEGIC CAPITAL RENEWAL PLAN

- Annually review condition of the District's 5.5-million square feet of building space and 857.7 acres of land
- Review and update replacement plans and timelines for major building components such as roofs, boilers, chillers, fire alarm, etc.
- Consult with Maintenance & Operations Supervisors to assess mechanical, electrical and plumbing needs
- Work with other departments (Curriculum, Security and Technology) to identify significant programmatic changes that require changes to building infrastructure
- Prioritize and identify funding sources (Annual Capital Projects Plan Improvements, General Obligation Bonds or Referendum Bonds)

### REPAIR PROGRAM GOALS

### SCHOOL BUILDING BASIC RENEWAL/RESTORATION AND SAFETY PROJECT

- Replace infrastructure that has reached the end of it's useful life
- Eliminate substandard environmental conditions
  - Air quality, Temperature, Lighting
- Increase security for the safety of students and staff
- Increase the overall efficiency of the building to decrease energy use
- Maintain roof replacement schedule
